DIGITAL BOOK SERVICES

A goal of our Library system is to continually evaluate and improve on the services we offer to our customers. With the increasing popularity of digital media, it was an easy decision to add Nook devices to our collection. Customers are able to rent a Nook device loaded with a variety of titles in several genres from any branch library in the system.

If customers already have a device and are looking for content, the library has that, too! We have been offering downloadable media through Overdrive for over a year, providing our card holders with eBooks and audiobooks that can be stored on any device of their choosing.




