

A YEAR OF NEW SERVICES AND PRODUCTS

This year was full of new offerings for our customers. All branches were equipped with self-check stations, much like grocery stores, that allow customers to scan their books for easy check-out. In addition to a fully automated system for checking out materials, these machines also allow customers to pay their fines with credit cards versus the “cash-only” method we previously had.

The Library’s digital download service was improved this year as we switched our contract to Overdrive. The new system offers more titles, easier downloading instructions, and a variety of formats for most any eBook or audiobook device.

In October 2012, the Library joined Link+, a consortial library borrowing system. Link+ spans California and Nevada and includes 51 public and academic member libraries whose combined collections provide customers with free access to an incredibly diverse wealth of materials. Now Stockton-San Joaquin County Public Library customers have access to over 9 million unique titles from a single online portal.

The Library is excited to continue working on bringing our customers excellent services and products and staying current with the needs of our community.

THE SSJCPL ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM

Stockton-San Joaquin County Public Library is working diligently to increase literacy rates in our service area and beyond.

Through one-on-one tutoring by volunteers in the community, the Adult Literacy program is able to work toward achieving the goal of increasing basic literacy skills of English-speaking adults so they can accomplish personal goals and participate more fully in society as parents, family members, employees, and as community members and citizens. The Literacy program is funded by a California Library Literacy Services grant and supported by the Library & Literacy Foundation for San Joaquin County.

SSJCPL also recognizes the need to work together with adults that primarily speak other languages but want to become stronger at speaking English.


To create an environment that is best suited to “practice” English, the Library began an English Conversation Club and kicked off their “Let’s Chat” program. English as a Second Language (ESL) adult learners are invited to come to an evening event in which they can simply socialize and chat as a way to better their understanding and delivery of the English language. Each session includes a topic of the day, shared reading, and a fun evening among a diverse group of people.






